All FCAs are designed in a manner to suit the nature of the subject, grade level, and course.

This information will be shared with the students by their subject teacher and will be clearly indicated in the Final Culminating Activity Days schedule that will be published by the school.
- If the student does not have a scheduled Final Culminating Activity on one of these 5 days (as

outlined in the schedule distributed by the school - January 24th - 29th), all students are able to come in to work with their teacher during that period to consolidate their learning, celebrate their success, and improve their achievement by either completing outstanding work or redoing a major summative assessment from throughout the course. Teachers will be available in the school on all FCA days, even if there is no scheduled final instructional activity for that class, to work with students.
