Rowan's Law Day:

Each year the DSBN recognizes Rowan's Law across all schools on the 4th Wednesday of September. On September 27th, Rowan's Law Day will be observed by our school. This is a day to increase awareness about the danger of concussions and to positively promote injury prevention. Rowan's Law was created after Rowan Stringer, a 17-year old student died after sustaining two concussions. Because she did not tell anyone about her injuries or share how she was feeling with her family, coaches or friends her concussions went untreated. By observing Rowan's Law Day each year and educating our school community about concussions, we hope to promote a culture of safety at our school. Purple was Rowan's favourite colour, so students and staff are encouraged to wear purple on Wednesday to represent Rowan.

The National Day for Truth and Reconciliation - September 30 (recognized this year on September 29th in DSBN):

- The National Day for Truth and Reconciliation became a federally observed holiday on July 20, 2021, to be observed on September 30th each year. Sharing this day with Orange Shirt Day, a day widely recognized across the country since 2013. This day provides an opportunity for Canadians to recognize and commemorate the legacy of Residential Schools
- On Friday, September 29th, students, and staff across the DSBN will wear Orange to recognize the harm that the Residential School System had on First Nations, Métis, and Inuit children and to recognize that, "Every Child Matters."
- Teachers will be able to provide activities to support the learning for students in the work towards truth and reconciliation and can access board approved resources
- This year, we have placed the circle display with tiles made by students in the library. We have extra blank tiles available for students to color and decorate, which will be used to add to the circle display following Truth and Reconciliation day this year.
