## Hall Monitoring:

- Initiative for month of February
- 2 teachers to monitor halls/washrooms communication going home this week
- Student voice showed us that there is a concern with inappropriate use of school washrooms. Specifically, some students are congregating in washrooms and engaging in inappropriate activities such as vaping and vandalism. This is making other students feel uncomfortable and unsafe using our washrooms. We know from connecting with our colleagues that this has become an issue province-wide, and is one that we are continuing to address.
- In MSIP classes, surveys will be conducted to gather further voice about how they feel about vaping and congregating in the washrooms.
- Some discussion around student progressive discipline could we use community service hours that students would engage in around the school after numerous infractions of congregating?

## Course Selection for 2023/2024:

- students are to choose their required courses, plus 2 alternate courses, via the Xello program.

# New Online Learning Graduation Requirement for current 9, 10 and 11 students:

- The Ontario Ministry of Education has added a 2 credit fully online learning requirement for the Ontario Secondary School Diploma for students. Current Grade 11 students were recognized as having completed 1 of the required credits, as a result of province-wide school closures, to count towards this graduation requirement. Students are able to choose online credits directly through Xello.
- Summer school and/or night school courses can count towards to these 2 online learning requirements as long as they are fully online elearning classes
