- Artificial Intelligence (AI): DSBN AI Committee exploring the responsible/appropriate use of AI in schools by teachers & students with focus on the following 2 main areas:
 - 1. Pedagogical and instructional integration
 - 2. Academic integrity, Assessment and evaluation
 - How familiar are parents with AI? Use of AI in their workplace, personal life, etc?
 - Social media organizing your thoughts, correcting grammar, structuring sentences makes life a lot of easier
 - Marketing, education, information/awareness
 - Some of stuff out of date (double check sources and information)
 - Organization will spit out a table and organizing
 - Terms of reference, generating abstracts for professional work
 - If give quality information into it, relative to quality of output
 - University use generate ideas and for jobs of the future
 - Need to watch for security and cyber security issues including bias
 - Trouble-shooting programming
 - Grammar checking
 - Tech support write in exactly what you need support with
 - Are they aware of student use? For what purpose? Etc.
 - Yes using it for much of their homework but they don't know enough to be able to check for information and use it responsibly
 - Using SIRI which is AI and now many using ChatGPT
 - Need to teach them using healthy boundaries; what is appropriate use vs inappropriate / cheating; challenges with understanding acade

O What do we think it should be used for?

■ By teachers?

- We need to use and practice it ourselves to be able to model responsible use with students, including lesson plans, assessment tools, etc.,
- Teaching students how to use it responsibly
- Example of teachers asking students for their voice on schools core values - Leslie took this information/data with specific prompts - asked AI to consolidate information
- Teachers having students do work in the front of them (written tasks) to ensure it is student's work hope to move into working with kids through this process of learning to use it properly in stages
- What does this look like in French Immersion since Google Translate has always been an issue...

■ By students?

- Teaching kids how to reference and use responsibly
- Idea generation help kids to move forward and a starting point for critical thinking
- Prompt generation this might be part of interviews in the future...
